Lighting

House lights 15-20% (low level); Up to 50% for audience participation

Coloured or moving lights

Yes – colour stage lights may move and project on walls. Bright sparking light from cold sparks at end of concert

Background sound

Yes – Background nature sound effects in Main Auditorium before/after concert

Loud sounds/noises/music

Yes – Many of the pieces can be loud at times. Cold sparks (whoosh) at end of concert

Drum

Yes – There will be various types of drums including timpani, bass and snare drums

High-pitched tones

Yes – Some instruments have high pitches tones, e.g. piccolo

Unexpected sounds (eg. crash) Yes – Cold sparks (whoosh) at

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Sing

No – optional audience participation during concert

Special effects

Yes – cold sparks at end of performance

Props

Animal statues on stage, animal soft toys placed in Main Auditorium and Foyer areas. The musicians may be dressed in animal costumes

Dialogue driven

Talking is evenly distributed across the concert by Presenter and Conductor. Only a few instances over the music

Substances that may fall on audience

Cold sparks (whoosh) at end of concert across front of stage

Intermission/break

No intermission. Concert duration – 50 minutes. You can leave at anytime if required

Introduction

Yes – 5 minutes. The preconcert activities will run for approximately half an hour prior to the concert

Children need to sit in one place

Yes – They will need to remain in their seat but can wriggle and move within their seat

Appropriate to make noise

It is not billed as a "Relaxed Performance"; however, we understand that children may wish to make noise during the concert and feel the music with their body
